& Incident Response – April 21, 1995**

**Bob Cassiello, OEM, Boro of Lodi**

**George Stanton, former Boro Chemical Engineer, Boro of Lodi**

Mr. Stanton handled chemical safety issues for the Boro of Lodi, including Napp Chemicals, for more than 19 years prior to the Napp explosion. He will describe the process that exploded, and his recollections of Napp Chemicals in the days before April 21, 1995. His presentation will include a video of the fire.

Mr. Cassiello, OEM Coordinator and former Fire Chief for the Boro of Lodi, will describe his experiences coordinating the response to this incident, including dealing with Napp personnel and the Boro, county, State, and Federal agencies who had jurisdiction or offered assistance.

George B. Stanton, Jr., PE, CSP, CIH, FASME, FAICHe, FRSPH, is a chemical engineer expert, consulting on chemical-related incidents, injuries, and illnesses. He and his firm, American Hazard Control Consultants, Inc., have been serving attorneys, governments, and industries for more than 30 years. Previously, he worked in the specialty chemicals industry and in government, and taught graduate courses in safety and industrial hygiene at NCE/NJIT, and NYU-The Center for Safety. He earned his BChE and MChE from Brooklyn Polytechnic; MBA and MA (Health and Safety) from NYU. He is active in our section.

Robert Cassiello has been the OEM for the Boro of Lodi since 1991. He has dealt with evacuations caused by flooding of the Saddle River, major fires, Anhydrous Ammonia leaks, and a mysterious airborne rash involving 50 daycare children. He earned an OSHA compliance officer certification, and a N.J. Fire Official certificate. And, he has taken courses in fire scene management, mass causality management, Industrial Hygiene, and Multiple Agency Response Management. He is currently employed as an Occupational Safety Consultant with the New Jersey Department of Transportation.

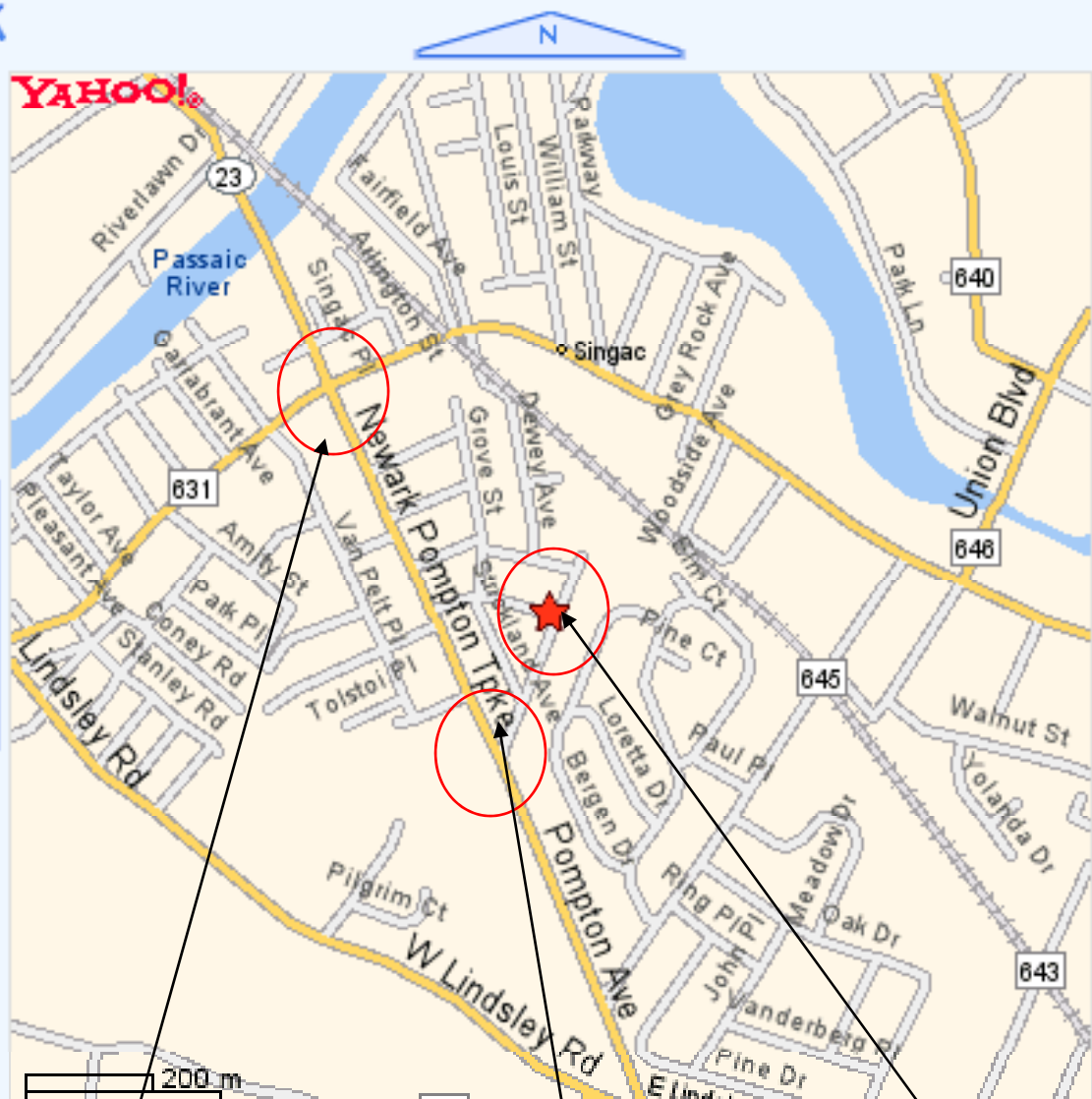
